

<u>Market Beef</u>: Tag-in will be on Saturday, December 6, 2008 from 8 a.m. – Noon at the fairgrounds. Bad weather date will be Saturday, December 13. Beef checks will be distributed at the Beef Annual Meeting-Oct 5, 3pm at Pegasus Farms on the Farm Tour. <u>Dairy</u>: The committee is working on a new class for the dairy project. We will have a Dairy Breed Market Steer class next year. This class will be separate from the market beef class. The dairy breed market steer will be judged on Wednesday of the fair and will sell at the Wednesday night sale. We are still ironing out all the rules, but basically they will be the same as the market beef rules. I will forward all the information as soon as it is available. Please remember—the dairy breed market steer project must be tagged in at the same time as the market beef (Saturday, December 6, 2008).

Sheep: New class for 2009! There will be a "Born and Raised Class for 2009. Rules are as follows:

- 1. Bred Ewes must be in the possession of the Junior Fair Member prior to lambing.
- 2. The lamb must be born on the Junior Fair member's place of residence.
- 3. Lambs must be tagged within 4 weeks of birth. Junior Fair members need to call the appropriate committee member to be tagged.
- 4. Lambs shown in the Born and Raised Class cannot be shown in a regular market class or vice versa.
- 5. Grand and Reserve Champions will be chosen in the Born and Raise category, and sold with the other champions at the lamb sale.
- 6. All other market rules apply, including tagging, weigh-in, and rate of gain rules.
- 7. Exhibitors may tag and feed 2 lambs for the Born and Raised Market Class. Any lambs tagged for the Born and Raised Class, but not exhibited in this division, may be used for other market classes, including carcass competition.
- 8. All exhibitors are limited to a total of three market animals in the live shows, and one carcass animal.
- 9. All other exhibitor rules apply.

The Annual Meeting and Swine Project Members picnic will be held on Sunday, September 28, 2009, at 1:00 p.m. in the Art Hall at the fairgrounds. Please bring table service for your family and a covered dish that will serve 8-10 people. Meat will be provided by the swine committee. Drinks will be furnished by grand and reserve champion winners (market and carcass winners). The annual meeting will be immediately following the picnic and checks will be handed out at that time! NO CHECKS WILL BE MAILED!! If you cannot pick up your check or have someone pick it up for you, please contact Pam's office for dates and times to pick up your check at my office. Pam will not have the checks until after Monday, September 29, and they must be picked up during her office hours or during times when Pam has a scheduled meeting in her office.
