

CAVY RULES 2019

I. JUNIOR FAIR GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

The Stark County Junior Fair operates under the authority of and in conjunction with the Stark County Senior Fair Board. The Junior Fair Board is a department of the Stark County Fair with its own objectives. These objectives in many instances, require rules or guidelines that differ significantly from those of other Stark County Fair Departments. Any boy or girl enrolled in a Stark County Youth organization is eligible to participate in the Stark County Junior Fair. They must abide by the rules and age limitations of said youth organization (4H, FFA, Grange, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, etc.)

- 1. To participate in 4H activities, youth must comply with the State 4H membership policy. 4H eligibility begins at age 5 (AND in Kindergarten as of January 1) and ends December 31st of the year in which they attain the age of 19.
- 2. Exhibitors in 4H classes must be enrolled in 4H club work in Stark County. Exhibits must be from 4H projects approved by the State or Local Extension office.
- 3. FFA or FHA exhibitors must be enrolled in Smith-Hughes Vocational Course in Stark County during the current year. Exhibits must be from vocational projects certified by the department instructor.
- 4. All members are encouraged to show in open class events.
- 5. Health rules for the livestock exhibits are the same as those governing all open class exhibits. Health papers must be shown, if requested, to the proper person before an animal is assigned a stall.
- 6. The Board of Directors of the Stark County Agricultural Society will, to the best of their ability, safeguard persons, livestock and articles on the grounds, but will not be responsible for injury, damage, disease, theft or loss of any kind.
- 7. Animals released due to illness or injury must have a signed release from the Vet, Junior Fair Coordinator and/or barn superintendent. Anyone who removes an animal without permission will be subject to a 1-yr. suspension.
- 8. Members must clean stalls or pens daily and keep the area neat and attractive. The committee reserves the right to withhold payment if any exhibitor does not keep his/her area clean and/or feed and water livestock.
- 9. Anyone assisting with showing another exhibitor's animal must be enrolled as a current 4H or FFA or other youth organization member in Stark County.
- 10. All animals must remain on exhibit at the fair until 6:00pm on Monday, the last day of the fair, EXCEPT market animals.
- 11. All animals sold remain the property of the member and in the member's care until fair release time, 4:00pm, Monday, the last day of fair.
- 12. Animals sold are not eligible to be shown again by that exhibitor or any other 4H or FFA member in any Junior Show in the county or state or independent fair.
- 13. Exhibitors are responsible for their own veterinary bill.
- 14. Veterinarians assigned to the fair for check-in will decide all matters of health, presence of disease and stall release.

- 15. Ribbons and suitable award will be provided by the Fair Board. It is the privilege of the Fair Board to prorate cash premiums if the budget is exceeded.
- 16. Eligible youth may be members of both 4H (clubs) and vocational agriculture (FFA) or of either group. In all cases, separate and different projects (also different animals and/or products) must be carried in 4H and in vocational agriculture by a member belonging in both organizations. Examples of different and separate projects are sheep breeding, market lambs; pullets, broiler. The same or similar animals or products cannot be shown in both organizations even though they may be carried under different projects or programs. An animal or product may not be shown in more than one county in 4H or FFA classes.
- 17. Stark County youth programs and the Junior Fair Board will not condone the use of alcohol or drugs by any of its members, volunteers or anyone else associated with the Junior Fair. The Junior Fair Coordinator, Junior Fair Board advisors, FFA advisors, Extension office and the Senior Fair Board will contact parents or legal authorities to handle individuals caught using or under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- 18. If a project animal dies after the designated possession date, members will not be permitted to replace the animal for the purpose of exhibition or sale in any Junior Fair event.
- 19. All entries are due on or before midnight of July 19, 2019 NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 20. All market animals to be shown, grooming must be done by Stark County Junior Fair exhibitor or the exhibitor's immediate family limited to mom, dad, brother, sister and grandparents. Also includes a Stark County Junior Fair show during the Stark County Fair August 27th September 2, 2019. Consequence of rule is no sale of animal.
- 21. No one is to handle a Junior Fair member's animal(s) without the permission of the Junior Fair exhibitor unless there is an emergency. Committee members may handle animals during the normal course of their duties (i.e., show, sale, weigh-in, pictures, loading, unloading).
- 22. Judges decisions are final.

It is MANDATORY for all Junior Fair exhibitors to attend a <u>QUALITY ASSURANCE TRAINING CLINIC</u> prior to the fair AND complete a <u>DRUG USE NOTIFICATION FOR (DUNF)</u> for all market animals and lactating dairy animals prior to the show. Those who do not comply, all market animals and lactating dairy animals prior to the show. Those who do not comply, <u>WILL NOT</u> be allowed to show! Ohio Revised Code 901-19-06 and 901-19-07, mandated by the Ohio Department of Agriculture. All members will be responsible for the care of their animals until 4:00pm the last day of the Stark County Fair, or until the drug withdrawal period elapses, or if quarantined.

II. CAVY RULES

- 1. Project animals must be purebred animals according to American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA). Contact a member of the Rabbit & Cavy Committee for help in finding purebred Cavies.
- 2. Cavy projects must be taken in order, regardless of the number of Cavies exhibitor is showing at the fair. Projects should not be repeated. Only ONE (1) Cavy Project may be taken per year. All youth with Cavy projects should participate in the Cavy Show.
- 3. All Cavies exhibited must be permanently earmarked by a tag in the left ear before arrival at the fair. (See enclosed calendar for date & time of Tattoo & Tag Clinic.) Cavies exhibited must be clean, free of parasites and in good health. The superintendent may send any animal home at their discretion.
- 4. Exhibitors are responsible for caring for their project animal daily through the last day of the fair. Care includes checking in or out, cleaning pens, feeding and watering. Any failure to fulfill these requirements

- will result in forfeiture of premium money. No early Departure. Exhibitors are responsible for bringing their own feed and bedding. (Bedding will be provided the first day of the fair only.)
- 5. No locks may be placed on cages.
- 6. All animals sold in <u>any</u> Junior Fair Show throughout the state, may not be shown or sold in <u>any</u> other Junior show within the same year.
- 7. There must be a minimum of 5 Cavies in a breed and 2 exhibitors for exhibitors to be eligible for trophies. Rosettes will be awarded if there are less than 5 animals.
- 8. Exhibitors winning a trophy must turn in an addressed, stamped thank you note to the Junior Fair Board when they pick up their trophy on Monday, September 2, 2019. The Rabbit & Cavy Committee will give out sponsors' name and address after the show.
- 9. In the event a project animal dies after the designated possession date, members will not be permitted to replace that animal for the purpose of exhibition or sale. Members may, however, replace the animal for the purpose of completing the project, showmanship or skill-a-thon. Exhibitors should report the death of any animal immediately to a Committee member.
- 10. All exhibitors will receive a \$3.00 premium per cavy project registration.
- 11. Parents or Advisors need to contact a member of the Rabbit & Cavy Committee if they have a participant with a learning or physical disability.
- 12. Each exhibitor should attend the Jr. Fair Cavy Show and show their own cavy(s). If this is not possible, you must notify the committee and you must find another Junior Fair exhibitor to show for you.

III. PURCHASING/POSSESSION

All project Cavies must be in the possession of the exhibitor by May 25th to be able to show at the Stark County Junior Fair. Exception: Intermediate or Junior Aged animals which are raised by exhibitor must have shown by May 25.

IV. CHECK IN

All Cavies must be checked in with the Jr. Fair Show Secretary, in the Rabbit Barn on Monday, August 26, between 12:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. All Cavies must be checked in and out with the Junior Fair Show Secretary. NO EXCEPTIONS!

IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED THAT ALL YOUTH WISHING TO EXHIBIT CAVIES AT THE JUNIOR FAIR ATTEND THE JULY PRE-REGISTRATION ENTRY CLINIC. FOR FIRST AND SECOND YEAR MEMBERS IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED THEY ATTEND THE SPRING EDUCATIONAL CLINIC.

The Junior Fair Cavy Show is under the supervision and direction of the Junior Fair Rabbit & Cavy Committee. The committee will supervise all shows and activities at the fair. Any questions regarding the rules, procedures etc. will be decided by a majority vote of the committee membership. The decision of the Judge is final.

A. **CAVY FAIR CLASSES**

- 1. Senior Boars and Sows- Over 6 months of age or weight over 32 ounces
- 2. Intermediate Boars and Sows- Up to 6 months of age, OR weight over 22 ounces and maximum weight of 32 ounces.

3. Junior Boars and Sows- Up to 4 months of age, minimum weight of 12 ounces maximum weight of 22 ounces.

B. **CAVY EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS**

CAVY I First year exhibitors – may exhibit TWO pens.

*MUST BE OF THE SAME BREED

**Exhibitor is to complete the beginner section of the new Ohio Cavy Book, member project guidelines, one-page report, record section of project book.

CAVY II Exhibitors who have completed Cavy I – may exhibit THREE pens

*Requires ONE senior and TWO of your choice –MUST BE OF THE SAME BREED

**Exhibitor is to continue in the Ohio Cavy Book, member project guidelines, one-page report, and record section of the project book. **

CAVY III Exhibitors who have completed Cavy II – may exhibit FOUR pens –

Two Breeds may be exhibited. If exhibiting two breeds, One Senior of each Breed and TWO of exhibitor's choice (either breed) (Offspring recommended)

*If exhibiting only ONE breed, requires ONE senior or intermediate and THREE of your choice and Offspring are recommended.

**Exhibitor is to continue in the Ohio Cavy Book, member project guidelines, one-page report, and record section of the project book. **

CAVY IV

Exhibitors who have completed Cavy III – may exhibit FIVE pens. If exhibiting two breeds, requires ONE senior, ONE junior or intermediate of each breed chosen and ONE of your choice (offspring recommended). If exhibiting one breed, requires ONE senior, ONE junior <u>OR</u> One Intermediate and THREE of your choice.

**Exhibitor is to continue in the Ohio Cavy Book, member project guidelines, one-page report, and record section of the project book. **

CAVY V & UP

Exhibitors who have completed Cavy IV — may exhibit SEVEN pens - may exhibit THREE Breeds. If exhibiting one breed, you must have one SENIOR, one INTERMEDIATE, one JUNIOR and four of exhibitor's choice. If exhibiting two breeds, you need one senior of each breed and five of exhibitor's choice (either breed). If exhibiting three breeds, you need one Senior of each breed and four of exhibitor's choice (any breed).

**Exhibitor must complete Advanced section of the Ohio Cavy Book, member project guidelines, one-page report, and record section of the project book. **

C. SKILLATHON PROJECT COMPLETION

The Junior Fair Rabbit & Cavy Committee has determined that each

Exhibitor must complete a Skillathon for project completion.

1. Bring completed project book and one-page report to Skillathon.

Divisions are the same as showmanship classes. If unable to attend Skillathon, books and reports must be turned into a committee member by Saturday, AUGUST 24, 2019. If books and reports are not turned in by deadline, your animal will not compete for any awards. Your animal will be judged at the end of the class for comments ONLY.

2. Skill-a-thon will consist of 5-6 stations, with each station being timed, to evaluate project knowledge.

D. **CAVY SHOWMANSHIP**

SHOWMANSHIP IS MANDATORY FOR FIRST- AND SECOND-YEAR EXHIBITORS

Showmanship is highly recommended for all other exhibitors. Exhibitors entering showmanship must sign in.

- 1. Exhibitors must show his/her OWN project animal. Anyone not doing so will be removed from the competition and forfeit any awards. (See exception in Rule #16.)
- 2. Exhibitors should have a good understanding of what is expected of themselves and their Cavy before entering showmanship classes. Attend the spring clinic for this information.
- 3. Exhibitors must be properly dressed. Arms must be covered by a long sleeve shirt or jacket, which can be removed after judging and should also protect clothing underneath.
- 4. Showmanship Classes are determined by exhibitor's age as of January 1, current year.

SENIOR 15 years and up INTERMEDIATE 12 – 14 years JUNIOR 8 – 11 years

5. An exhibitor may win only once in a showmanship class. These exhibitors may compete in Champion of Champion Showmanship while waiting to move into the next showmanship class.

E. CHAMPION OF CHAMPION CAVY SHOWMANSHIP

- 1. Winners of Cavy Showmanship classes (see list above) and any other exhibitors who have won or participated in Champion of Champions in the past but are not eligible to move into the next class yet may participate in Champion of Champions.
- 2. Champion of Champion Cavy Showmanship will be held in the Rabbit Barn on Saturday at 11:00 a.m. during the fair. The order of competition will be decided by a drawing held before the

- competition. You must be present and sign in by 10:45 a.m. or FORFEIT you right to participate.
- 3. The winner of Champion of Champions will participate in the Showman of Showman Contest. If the Champion does not wish to participate, the Reserve Champion may go in his/her place.
- 4. The winner of Champion of Champions may return to defend the title each year until they advance to the next division. Then they must start over again.

F. CAVY SALES

Exhibitors wanting to put their Junior Fair Cavies up for sale may do so <u>after the Cavy Show</u>, by entering the information in the Junior Fair Cavy Sales Book. A 10% Sales Commission will be taken from all Cavy checks to be used for Junior Fair Rabbit & Cavy Committee expenses.

G. CHECK OUT

August 26

All Cavies will remain on exhibit until 6:00 p.m. on the last day of the fair, except for sold animals, which are released at 4:00 p.m. NO CAVIES will be released except through the Jr. Fair Show Secretary. If an animal is removed from the fair early without checking with a committee member or junior fair secretary, the junior fair member will not be permitted to show at the fair next year!
